It's a note from the principal ...


Dear Werner Community,





Counseling Corner





For those who do not know me, I am the School Counselor at Werner. My name is Julie Flemister and my office is located just west of the cafeteria. I am fortunate to teach in the classroom every other week different social skills, including but not limited to, getting along skills, conflict resolution, how to calm ourselves if we are feeling nervous or anxious, and Acts of Kindness.

My focus this year will be on helping students with resiliency and mindfulness. I will be addressing calming strategies along with skills on how to develop a growth mindset. I teach many of these skills through bully-proofing, empathy, respect, and kindness lessons.

I also have lunch with many of the students, so please do not be alarmed if your student comes home and says they had lunch with the counselor. I can have 2-3 students from the same class 3 feet apart during lunch. I feel it so important to know each student, so if something does come up, they are comfortable coming and talking with me. I also help in crisis, talking with students, and working with parents on helping their child feel successful in school.

I also refer to Love and Logic as a parent and as a counselor. The following article is taken from their email resources. I am learning to step back with my own children and hopefully teaching them that they do have the power to figure out some things out on their own (resiliency). I want them to know I believe in each one and they are capable of problem solving. I do not want my kids to be in a situation when I am not around, and they have no idea how to resolve it. One of the greatest gifts we can give our children is independent thinking. Teachers can help with this skill too.

The Best Gift for a Teacher

Centuries ago, I presume, a tradition developed whereby parents felt compelled to provide a tangible expression of their gratitude toward teachers. The original motivations for this tradition are unclear. Some may have been prompted by genuine appreciation; others may have been spurred by guilt and attempts to atone for the unruly classroom conduct of their children; some may have darker motivations where it was hoped a small payoff would "grease the wheels" a bit toward a better grade for their child.

While I'm sure that most educators truly appreciate the gesture, I'm not sure how many apples an average person can eat. I wonder how many of those cute little picture frames, paper weights, plaques, and other cute thingies eventually get regifted.

Of course, all of us dedicated educators want to be appreciated for our hard work, long hours, and willingness to be exposed to every germ known to humankind. It's nice to be appreciated for the fact that we choose to love kids even when they behave badly and produce noxious fumes. It's great to be appreciated for the fact that we take classrooms full of kids with different needs, abilities, behaviors, and troubles and turn them into high-powered learning teams.

Great teachers are amazing!

The best gift we can give them involves our own parenting. The most wonderful display of our appreciation is to send them students truly ready to be respectful, responsible, and eager to learn. No doubt this gift also benefits our children, who will rise to the top when equipped with such character attributes.

Listed below are just a few things you can do:

- Make sure that your kids overhear you saying positive things about their school and their teachers.
- Ensure that they are doing chores without reminders at home, so that they know how to do assignments without reminders at
- Allow very little time with technology, including video games, texting, surfing the web, watching videos, television, etc. These activities make it more difficult for our children to remain calm and
- Have family meals together, where you enjoy each other and talk about all of the things you've learned during the day.




RETURN TO LEARN: Guidance Following a Positive COVID-19 Symptom Screen



Any symptomatic individuals should lectate from symptom onset and pursue evaluation, including testing as soon as possible. If symptoms develop at school and point of care testing is exclicitle, testing may be parformed following an initial assessment using the Addressing Symptoms at School tool.

Anyone who tests positive using any viral diagnostic test type (not antibody tests) should be treated as a case and should isolate. No additional test results can end a symptometic positive individual's isolation period sarly.

Symptomatic individuals within 90 days of a previous positive viral diagnostic test (not artibody test) and those who are fully vaccinated (2 weeks after final dase) should believe, be investigated for potential infection in consultation with public health entitor a healthcare provider, and may require testing prior to return to school.













Mask FAQs

- Protective masks should cover the nose and mouth, with multiple layers and that fit snugly against a person's face.
- · Masks are NOT required outdoors.
- Teachers and students will have opportunities to have mask breaks.
- Schools will have extra masks on hand, for those who need them.
- When you're in a room with someone else, your mask should be on.

PSD COVID-19 mask protocols

Masks are required for all staff, students, visitors and volunteers in PSD buildings, regardless of vaccination status.

Why masks in PSD

- We want to keep students and staff safe and keep kids in school, while minimizing quarantines. When both parties are masked, neither individual should be quarantined if there is a COVID case.

PSD COVID-19 protocols for fall 2021

Some have changed since the spring of 2021, while others will be familiar. This is not an exhaustive list. For all protocols, please visit the <u>Health and Safety web page</u>.

What's different?



Close contact is now defined as being less than 3 feet for a cumulative 15 minutes in 24 hours versus 6 feet, per public health guidance.

- All activities and athletics are happening with protocols.
- All secondary students can use lockers.
- Water fountains are turned back on.
- Students at all schools can eat in cafeterias.
- School assemblies are allowed with masks, 3 feet spacing and assigned seats.

Close contact quarantine exemptions include:

- · Fully vaccinated · Both parties are masked
- Positive for COVID 90 days prior Participated in weekly testing

With masks, we expect that fewer people will be quarantined.

Quarantines may still occur due to exposures at lunch (no masks while eating) and high-risk activities (athletics, performing arts). There may be other instances where these may occur.

What's the same?



Keep washing your hands.

We will do this before and after recess, as well as before and after meals.

- Students don't have to wear masks outdoors or at recess, and students from different grades can play outside at the same time.
- Stay home if you are experiencing symptoms
 (runny nose, new/worsening cough, fever, etc.). Follow

 Return to Learn guidance to come back to school.
- If you are deemed to be a close contact in a COVID case, the health department will ask you to quarantine for 10 days.
- There is still the option for an early release on day eight of quarantine, following the early test-out process.
- PSD will continue using Precautionary Rooms
 (formerly Isolation Rooms) to separate symptomatic
 students from peers and staff.



Contact tracing

PSD will continue working with the Larimer County.
Department of Health and.
Environment (LCDHE) to conduct contact tracing investigations when there is a COVID case.

- PSD and LCDHE will identify whether anyone had close contact. LCDHE will ask dose contacts to guarantine.
- In a routine classroom exposure (i.e. third graders sitting at desks), LCDHE
- will likely not quarantine individuals if the county's vaccination rate is greater than 70% among those eligible to be vaccinated.
- PSD will still notify families when there is a classroom/
- cohort exposure, even if no quarantines occur. The entire school community will not be notified.
- Case information will be available on the COVID-19 data web page.



What to do if you're experiencing symptoms

Do your part. Don't come to school if you're experiencing symptoms. Even a runny nose counts. PSD follows the <u>Colorado</u> Department of <u>Public Health and Environment's Return to Learn guidelines</u>. Parents should monitor their children for symptoms and keep them home if they are experiencing any of the following:

Critical symptoms

 Loss of taste or smell

Major symptoms

- Feeling feverish, having chills
- Temperature of
 100.4 F or greater

Minor symptoms

- Sore throat, runny nose or congestion
- Muscle or body aches




Vaccination FAQs
