Science and Engineering Fair

Dear Werner Community,

The Werner Elementary School Science and Engineering fair will be held on March 31st. All students are invited to participate. Students



may work independently, with a partner, or in groups of three. We will have two divisions, K-2 and 3-5. All students who complete a project will get to share their results with friends and will receive a participatory ribbon, a scoring sheet with comments, and accolades from their teachers. This is a great opportunity for students to make a scientific discovery or develop their building and engineering skills. It's also a fun and memorable experience for kids!

There are many incentives to participate. Everyone who completes a project will receive a participatory ribbon and will have the opportunity to share their project with their peers. First place winners' names from each division will also be engraved on our Science Fair plaques beside the Werner trophy case!

So how do you get started? Completing a project is not as hard as it sounds. Projects following the scientific method should include:

- Research question (topic)
- Hypothesis (prediction)
- Procedure (the steps taken to carry out the experiment)
- Results (observations, data, etc.)
- Conclusions (discussion/reflection on what was learned)

Engineering projects should include: a problem, background research (optional), and preliminary designs and sketches. Then, your child should build a prototype (this can be a smaller model of their invention) and test it

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2023 Colorado Measures of Academic Success (CMAS)

Werner's annual state CMAS testing for English Language Arts/Literacy (ELA), Mathematics and Science starts on Tuesday, April 4th for students



in 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade. These tests are only one measure of a child's achievement. For the most complete information on a student's progress, contact your student's teacher. The entire body of evidence—class assignments, formative and summative assessments, and projects—paints a clearer picture of student progress. If you want more information regarding CMAS testing including exempting students, visit PSD Assessment website.

To minimize interruptions, please try to avoid scheduling events that would cause your child to be out of school during testing sessions. Also, electronic devices are not allowed in the room during testing. This includes e-readers, phones, tablets, and wrist devices.

To assure your child has a positive testing experience, make sure they get a good night's sleep prior to testing and be sure to offer some encouraging words on test day.

Counseling Corner

March 2023

Every grade learns about normal peer conflict and what is a bully. We discuss that not every mean person is a bully. Kindergarten focuses more on how to be a good friend. I want students to understand the difference and know that they have the power to help themselves and each other. Students learn about bystanders and how to become an upstander.

Please ask your student(s) about what they are learning in counseling when I go into the classroom to teach.

1st and 2nd Grade are learning these tools:

Tools for Dealing with Mean People and Bullies:

- 1. Stand up for yourself. Tell the person to "Stop!"
- 2. Walk away and ignore. Get away from the person who is not being kind.
- 3. Say good things to yourself. Don't believe the negative.
- 4. Get help if it does not stop.

I also developed tools for student in $3^{rd} - 5^{th}$ to use when they feel or see someone else being bullied or having conflict with another person. Please ask your student(s) about the tools and what they have learned from the bully-proofing lessons. It spells out **Everyone HAS A ROAR**.

WHAT I CAN DO IF I OR SOMEONE ELSE IS BEING BULLIED OR BEING MEAN:

EVERYONE is included

Help (FIND A TRUSTING ADULT)

ASSERT YOURSELF ("STOP!")

SELF TALK (POSITIVE THINGS TO SELF)

AVOID (STAY AWAY FROM THE BULLY)

RESPECT (Be respectful to others & property)

OWN MY BEHAVIOR (What was my role?)

ATTITUDE THAT IS POSITIVE (People choose positive people)

RESPONSIBILITY (Responsible to be a positive role model)

Please talk with your child about Cyberbullying. 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade students will be taught the following if cyberbullied:

- 1. Do NOT respond.
- 2. Do NOT delete (may need proof for an adult to see). The adult can then decide to delete it or not.
- 3. Do not keep it to yourself! Tell a trusting adult.
- 4. Do NOT believe what the bully says.

We talk a lot about how to build empathy and acceptance, so we have fewer mean people, bullies, and bystanders. I also refer to Love and Logic as a parent and as a counselor. The language of ACCEPTANCE and RESILENCY continue to be discussed whether it comes up during career development, bullies, conflict, and other life skills. The following is from Love and Logic that demonstrates positive self-talk, resiliency, and learning from failure can be taught in and out of the classroom.

Shaping Self-Concept

Dear Insider,

Over the past several decades, psychologists have placed huge emphasis on the importance of having a positive self-concept. Rightly so! How we feel about ourselves may be the single most important factor affecting how motivated we are to succeed in school, the types of friends we select, and whether we make responsible decisions in our lives.

Due to its undisputed importance, people have spent tremendous energy trying different approaches to give kids good self-concepts. Listed below are just a few of the many tactics that have created selfish kids rather than ones with a good sense of self:

- Constant praise
- Ensuring that they are always the center of attention
- Making sure that they never encounter any hardships
- Buying them everything they want
- Rescuing them from the consequences of their misbehavior
- Setting no limits so that they can "express their creativity"

There's only one approach that really works, and it's based on the age-old truism:

The best way to feel good is to do something good.

When parents place a high emphasis on good and respectful behavior, children look at themselves and think, "I act pretty darn good and responsible. I must be pretty darn good and responsible."

True self-concept is developed when children encounter struggles, are taught how to overcome those struggles, and see themselves acting in respectful and responsible ways. Stated quite simply, self-concept is an inside job.

Shaping Self-Concept, one of our most popular audios, teaches a very special type of love. It's the type that allows our kids to struggle, lets them work through their trials, and guides them toward independence instead of insecurity. This love can be expressed daily by:

- Allowing kids to wrestle with tying their shoes, instead of automatically jumping in and doing it for them.
- Letting them dress themselves, even if the clothes they choose don't match.
- Teaching them how to talk to their teachers about problems at school, rather than always doing it for them.
- Expecting that they speak up and order meals for themselves, instead of ordering for them.
- Having them call the insurance company and arrange for their own car insurance, instead of doing it all for them.
- Letting them do most of the work required to complete their college applications, rather than preparing all the paperwork for them.
- Remembering that the more things they learn to do for themselves, the stronger and more confident they will become!




